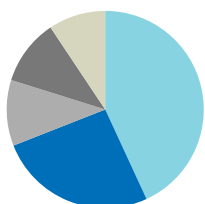


Dreyfus Prime Money Market Fund – Class A

Asset Allocation¹



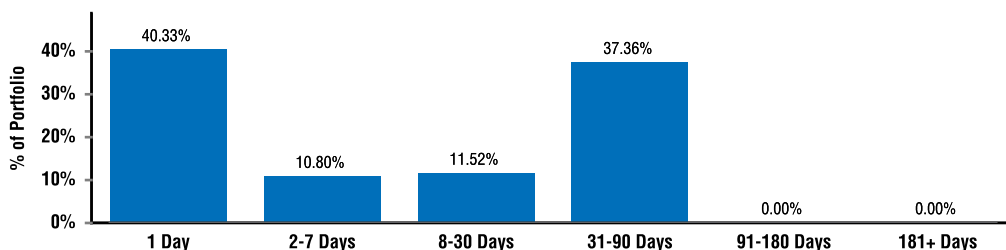

Generally, for money market funds, WAM can be used primarily as a measure of relative sensitivity to interest rate changes.

⁶WAL is the WAM of the money market fund calculated without reference to the "maturity shortening" provisions of Rule 2a-7 permitted for purposes of calculating WAM. Because WAL does not reflect the rule's "maturity shortening" provisions, WAL will generally be higher than WAM.

⁷Monthly yield history is the annualized distribution rate that is based upon dividends per share from net investment income paid during the period, divided by the period ended maximum offering price per share, adjusted for capital gains (IF ANY) distributed during the period, and annualized based upon the number of days in the distribution period.

Fund Goal

The fund seeks as high a level of current income as is consistent with the preservation of capital and the maintenance of liquidity.

Investment Approach

To pursue its goal, the fund normally invests in a diversified portfolio of high-quality, short-term, dollar-denominated debt securities, including: securities issued or guaranteed as to principal and interest by the U.S. government or its agencies or instrumentalities; certificates of deposit, time deposits, bankers' acceptances and other short-term securities issued by domestic or foreign banks or thrifts or their subsidiaries or branches; repurchase agreements, including triparty repurchase agreements; asset-backed securities; municipal securities; domestic and dollar-denominated foreign commercial paper, and other short-term corporate obligations, including those with floating or variable rates of interest; and dollar-denominated foreign government obligations. Normally, the fund invests at least 25% of its assets in domestic or dollar-denominated foreign bank obligations.
