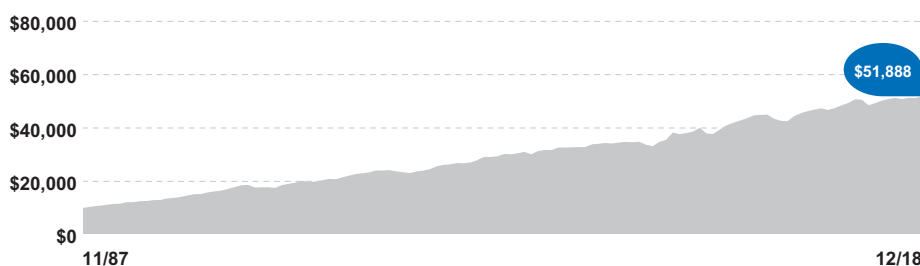

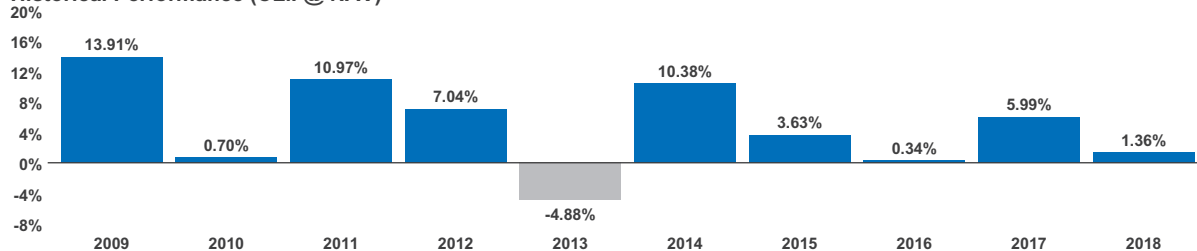
## Growth of a \$10,000 Investment<sup>1</sup>

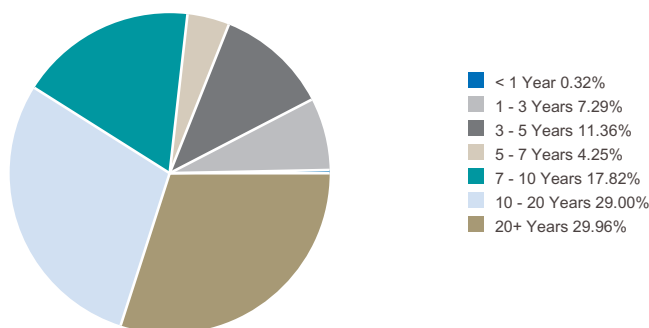

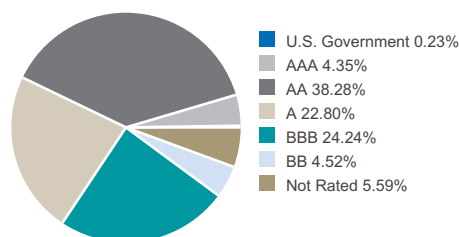

## Goal/Approach

The fund seeks as high a level of current income exempt from federal and New Jersey personal income taxes as is consistent with the preservation of capital. To pursue this goal, the fund normally invests at least 80% of its assets, plus any borrowings for investment purposes, in municipal bonds that provide income exempt from federal and New Jersey personal income taxes. The fund invests at least 80% of its assets in investment grade municipal bonds or the unrated equivalent as determined by Dreyfus. The fund may invest up to 20% of its assets in municipal bonds rated below investment grade ("high yield" or "junk" bonds) or the unrated equivalent as determined by Dreyfus.

## Portfolio Management

The fund's investment adviser is The Dreyfus Corporation (Dreyfus). The fund's primary portfolio managers are Daniel Barton, CFA and Jeffrey Burger, CFA, positions they have held since December 2009 and March 2012, respectively. Mr. Barton is a portfolio manager and senior analyst for tax sensitive strategies at Mellon Investments Corporation (Mellon), an affiliate of Dreyfus. Mr. Burger is a senior portfolio manager for tax sensitive strategies at Mellon. Messrs. Barton and Burger are also employees of Dreyfus. Mellon investment professionals manage Dreyfus-managed funds pursuant to a dual-employee arrangement, under Dreyfus' supervision, and apply Mellon's proprietary investment process in managing the funds.
